



iCareTrack II: Barriers and Facilitators to Appropriate Eyecare Service Delivery in Australia: Understanding the Gap

Researchers at UNSW Sydney (The University of New South Wales) are seeking volunteer research participants to learn about barriers and facilitators associated with optometrists' adherence to clinical practice guidelines for diabetic and glaucoma eyecare and how they impact care being provided.
